The Soul After Death

If you have ever visited another country, chances are you did some research before leaving. You probably bought some guidebooks, did a bit of research on travel conditions and places to visit and stay, and maybe even learned a few phrases in a new language. Naturally, you wanted to feel prepared before you embarked on your journey.

How many people, however, take as much trouble preparing for their journey after death? Our Orthodox Tradition has much to tell us about how to prepare for death and the afterlife. The previous talk addressed questions of how people today regard death and dying. In the present talk the emphasis will be on practical questions every Orthodox Christian should be prepared to answer:

- How should an Orthodox Christian prepare for death?
- What visions do the dying often experience?
- How can our Guardian Angel help us during and after death?
- What do we mean by the “toll-houses”?
- How can we help the newly-departed?
- How and why does God judge us?
- What are heaven and hell like?

Modern secular society tells us that we should prepare for death by relaxing, taking it easy, and looking forward to meeting our loved ones in heaven. The Orthodox Church, on the other hand, teaches that preparing for death requires prayer, repentance, spiritual struggle, and faith in God’s mercy. Both of these approaches cannot be true. It remains for us to decide which is true to the Gospel.
